

ORDINANCE DECLARING TWO SIGNS ON INTERSTATE HIGHWAY 40
TO BE OFFICIAL SIGNS OF THE TOWN OF OLD FORT

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Old Fort, North Carolina, is authorized by North Carolina law to erect and maintain official signs and notices within the territorial jurisdiction of the Town of Old Fort; and

WHEREAS, Interstate Highway 40, which is the most heavily traveled highway in McDowell County, passes within the territorial jurisdiction of the Town of Old Fort; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen finds it necessary and desirable to declare that certain signs and notices which presently identify, the Town and the limits of its municipal boundaries to travelers of Interstate Highway 40 are official signs and notices within the meaning of Subpart B of the National Standards for Directional and Official Signs, found in the Code of Federal Regulations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Old Fort, North Carolina, that the following two signs, located within 660 feet of the right of way of Interstate Highway 40, are hereby declared to be official signs of the Town of Old Fort, North Carolina:

- 1) The sign on the westbound side of Interstate Highway 40, approximately 50 feet east of Lackey Town Road, being a Travelers Information Sign for the Town of Old Fort;
- 2) Located in Westerly Direction 5 miles from Intersection of State Road 1274 (Catawba River Road) and 1-40 Eastbound Exit Ramp at Exit 73, being approximately 10 feet on South Side of State Road 1274, being a Travelers Information Sign for the Town of Old Fort on the Eastbound side of Interstate Highway 40.
